LESSON ACTIVITIES - EXPLANATION

Farm

Math

Sort farm animals - Sort farm toys by number of legs (or other attributes).

Pig in the Mud game -Print out the pig sheet and laminate for sturdiness. Use Unifix cubes, LEGO bricks, or any other counters along with dice.

Farm animal shapes Make farm animals out
of construction paper
shapes after reading
Color Farm. This shape
cow is an example.

Animal counting - Print out the number barns. Print out multiple copies of the sheep, rooster, and calf cards. Children place the correct number of animals by each barn number.

Measure feed - Use measuring cups with oats or corn. Explore the concepts of full and empty, along with beginning measurement. (77)

Science

Animal matching -Match pictures of baby animals to their parents. (TF)

Animal products - Make a list of different farm animals and the products that come from each animal.

Growing vegetables Grow new vegetables
from old scraps.
Experiment with carrot
tops, celery, green
onions, and potatoes.
What did you observe?

Make bread - Find a recipe for baking bread. Work together to measure, mix, and bake. Talk about where each ingredient came from.

Floating egg experiment - How can you make an egg float using salt and water?

Literacy

Farm word list Brainstorm a list of words
related to the farm
(farm animals, foods
and crops, equipment,
etc.). Write them down
and add pictures. Then
put them up for
reference the rest of the
theme.

"On the Farm" bookmaking - Create farm animal art to go along with each page in this homemade book.

Farm rhyming game -Listen to two words. Oink if they rhyme (or choose a different animal sound to make).

Farm animal beginning letters - Use magnetic letters and farm animal toys or pictures. Match the animal to the letter it begins with.

Little Red Hen sensory retelling - After reading the story of the Little Red Hen, retell it using simple materials and farm animals.

Other

"Haystacks" snack -Make this treat together, measuring and mixing according

to the directions.

Pigs in the mud sensory play - Sing a simple rhyme while exploring "muddy" sensory play.

Mixed—up scarecrow
art - Make a process art
canvas using paint and
items to represent the
parts of a scarecrow.
Use heavy weight
paper instead of a
canvas if that's
preferred.

<u>Puppet show</u> - Put on a puppet show using the shoebox farm and craft stick farm animals made during independent art time.

Farm trip - Take a trip to a local farm. Be sure to bring the camera.

Extend the experience by making a book about the trip. (77)

(77) - Toddler-friendly ideas that would work when home with children of different ages.

INDEPENDENT ACTIVITIES

Farm

These activities would work well as centers or work boxes during free play time. They're meant to allow children the chance to play, explore, and practice preschool skills on their own. Children may still need some assistance at times, of course. They're broken down by subject area for reference. (77) =Toddler-Friendly

Math

Farm Number Cards - Kids can use the printable number cards to sequence and count. Add farm animals and let them practice one-to-one correspondence by placing the correct number of animals by each card.

Animal sorting - Leave different animal toys out so kids can sort (by number of legs, type of animal). (77)

Sensory

Magnet Letters in "Feed" Add magnetic letters to oats
or corn. Children can explore
the sensory aspects of the
"feed", measure, pour, scoop,
and locate letters.

Simple Farm Sensory Play - Use whichever of these items you have on-hand. They represent different farm animals (chickens, sheep, etc.) and relate to wonderful farm-themed books. (TF)

Literacy

Farmer's Market Pretend Play -Set out whatever materials you have on-hand (real or fake produce, gardening gloves, garden hats, cash register, etc.). Children pretend to run a stand at the farmer's market! (TF)

<u>Letter Matching</u> - Children can use the printable farm animal cards to match uppercase and lowercase letters.

Block Play

Barn Building - Use wooden blocks of all shapes and sizes to create barns. Add toy animals, farmers, and tractors to extend the play. (77)

Science


<u>Play Dough Barn Building</u> - Use craft sticks and play dough to construct a standing barn. Extend this activity by adding farm animals for pretend play once the barn is finished.


Farm Feed Sensory Bottles -Add various materials (corn, straw, oats, dirt, etc.) to empty bottles. Let the children explore them throughout the week. (77)

Arts and Crafts

Barn Art - Put out markers, glue, and construction paper. Kids can use those materials to design and create their own barn scenes.


Puppets and Theater - Kids can use construction paper and craft sticks to create farm animal and farmer puppets. They can use a cardboard box and paint or markers to create a barn puppet theater.




















































































































































































Below you'll find picture cards of farm animals. Each animal has a baby version and an adult version.


The Dice Game


The dice game is meant for 2 players. Each player chooses a different color crayon, and the players share one paper.


Player 1 rolls the die, then colors in the appropriate number. Player 2 then takes her turn. They go back and forth until all numbers have been colored in. The player with the most numbers colored is the winner of the game.

Put the Mud on the Pig

This math game can be played individually or in a group. Children begin with a laminated pig play mat, brown or black unifix cubes (or some other counters), and 1 or 2 dice.
